

Whenever due to any accident or other unforeseen act or even, such emissions occur or is apprehended to occur in excess of standards laid down, such information shall be forthwith Reported to Board, concerned Police Station, office of Directorate of Health Services, Department of Explosives, Inspectorate of Factories and Local Body. In case of failure of pollution control equipments, the production process connected to it shall be stopped.
5. You shall provide an alternate electric power source sufficient to operate all pollution control facilities installed to maintain compliance with the terms and conditions of the consent. In the absence, the applicant shall stop, reduce or otherwise, control production to abide by terms and conditions of this consent.
6. You shall submit, the Environmental Statement Report for the financial year ending 31st March in the prescribed Form-V as per the provisions of rule 14 of the Environment (Protection) (Second Amendment) Rules, 1992 to Regional Office, , the 30th day of September every year.
7. You shall recycle/reprocess/reuse/recover Hazardous Waste as per the provision contain in the HW (MH&TM) Rules 2008, which can be recycled /processed /reused /recovered and only waste which has to be incinerated shall go to incineration and waste which can be used for land filling and cannot be recycled/reprocessed etc should go for that purpose, in order to reduce load on incineration and landfill site/environment.

9. An inspection book shall be opened and made available to the Board's officers during their visit to the HCE.

AND WHEREAS, as per the decision of CAC meeting dtd, 25.08.2025, this office has issued a show cause notice for refusal of CCA vide above reference (4) and asked to submit Bank Guarantee of Rs. 2.75 Lakh, non provision of ETP & STP within 6 months as per previous consent condition., Started construction without obtaining C to E for establishments, membership of CBMWTFD and non payment of CCA fees and penal charges and not complied with the minutes of the personal Hearing dtd. 07.04.2025.

AND WHEREAS, you have failed to submit reply to the Show Cause Notice for Refusal of CCA, even after a sufficient & reasonable opportunity was given for the submission of the same. Due to non-submission of a reply to the Show Cause Notice for Refusal of CCA within the stipulated time period, the Board is unable to take a decision about the grant of the combined consent and BMW Authorization

WHEREAS, this office is in receipt of your application for grant of Combined Consent to operate and Bio-Medical Authorization under section 26 of the Water (Prevention of Control of Pollution) Act, 1974 & under section 21 of the Air (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1981 and Bio-Medical Waste Management Rules, 2016 as amended and Authorization under Hazardous & Other Wastes (Management & Transboundry Movement) Rules, 2016.

AND WHEREAS, Board office has issued Show Cause Notice for Refusal of CCA vide reference (3) above as per decision of CAC meeting dtd, 30/07/2024 in which asked to submit the information regarding discharge of sewage into Municipal sewer line and Not provided ETP & STP for the treatment of effluent/sewage. Also, to pay the penal charges of Rs. 4,01,920/- and to submit the Bank Guarantee of Rs. 2.75 Lakh as per previous consent.

AND WHEREAS, you have failed to submit the reply to the Show Cause Notice for Refusal of CCA and to submit Bank Guarantee and not paid the requisite penal charges even sufficient & reasonable opportunity given for the submission of the same.

AND WHEREAS, this case was again discussed in the CAC meeting dtd. 07.01.2025 & 14.01.2025 and it was decided not to consider the case and to call HCE Authority for personal Hearing. Accordingly, personal hearing of your hospital was extended on 07.04.2025 and during personal hearing, it was noted that new cancer building construction activity was found in progress and 3rd floor slab work is completed. For which, you have not obtained consent to establish for expansion -CCA and not submitted details of Environmental Clearance .

AND WHEREAS, during the personal hearing, it was also noted that you have not replied to the Show Cause Notice for refusal of CCA and not provided ETP & STP and discharging trade effluent and sewage in to the Municipal sewer line without treatment. You have also not paid the penal charges for delay in renewal application and not submitted Bank Guarantee of Rs. 2.25 Lakh as per previous CCA. You have started new building construction work of Cancer Hospital without Board's consent to establish for Expansion and not submitted details of Environmental Clearance and Expansion of Hospital .

AND WHEREAS, Dean and/or competent authorities were not present before Hon'ble Chairman of the Board, for the personal hearing.

In view of above, your application for grant of Consent combined consent to operate and BMW Authorization is hereby refused under Section 27 of the Water (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1974 and Section 21 (4) of the Air (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1981 for the above non-compliances. If you are aggrieved by this order, you may prefer an appeal as per provision in the Water (P&CP) Act 1974 & the Air (P&CP) Act 1981 within 30 day's time from the date of receipt of this letter,

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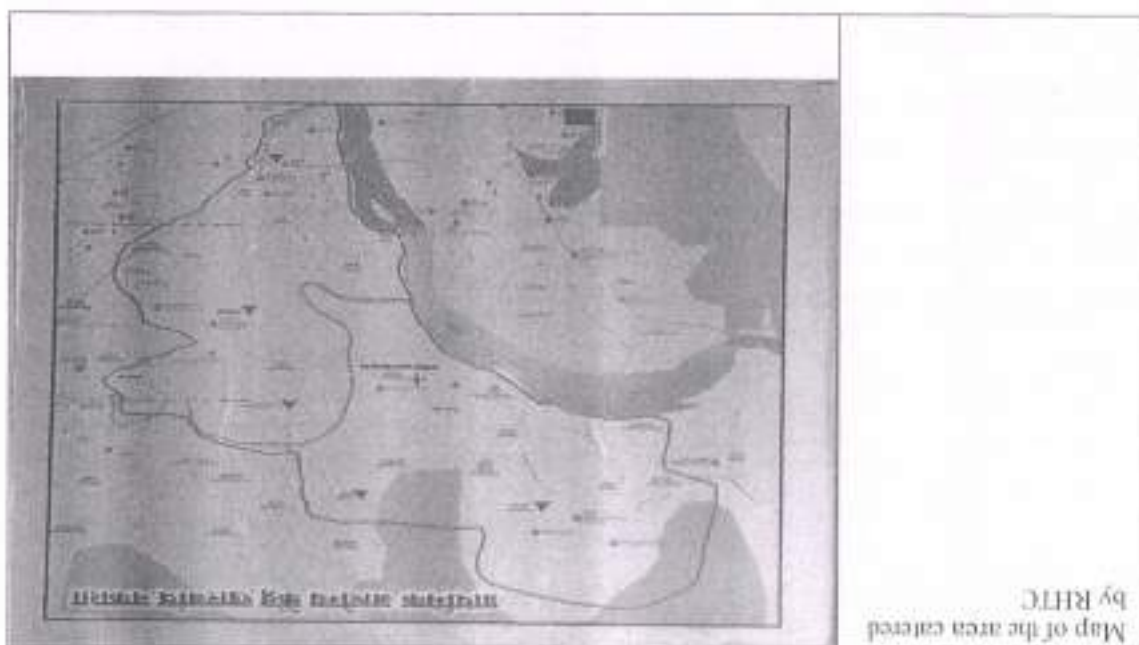

- To provide continuous observation of HCAs cases for the purpose of prevention and control to obtain useful information for establishing priorities for infection control activities.

- Develop, implement and monitor infection prevention practices in operating rooms with the Theatre sub-committee
- Develop, implement and monitor airborne infection control plan with Airborne Infection Control sub-committee
- Develop and implement policies pertaining to isolation
- Implement and monitor biomedical waste management
- Provide guidance on setting up of infrastructure, engineering and ventilation that would minimize the risk of infection
- Communicate effectively with concerned staff/ department
- Stay updated with the current developments

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Chairman:

- Serve as the chairperson of the committee and nominate the convenor / secretary.
- Constitute sub-committees to oversee specific infection prevention plans.
- Ensure that appropriate resources in terms of manpower, equipment and consumables are available at all times to prevent the risk of infection.
- Ensure that effective arrangements are in place for infection prevention and control and that appropriate resources are made available to manage the risks of infection.
- Promote a culture of safety and accountability in all staff members.
- Approve suggestions of the committee and authorize the committee to monitor compliance.
- Approve the list of committee members and their role.
- Review the data on HCAs and approve suggested corrective measures.
- In absence, authorize Deputy Dean to chair the committee.

Secretary / Convener

- Report directly to Dean.
- Convene meetings after obtaining consent from the chairperson.
- Identify the agenda / points of discussion for these meetings.
- Oversee local infection control policy implementation with ICC, ICO and ICN.
- Authorized by chairperson / Dean, to intervene when inappropriate practices are brought to notice by ICD / ICN.
- Assess the impact of current practices, provide feedback to departments/ and section /s and with HICC plan appropriate interventions if needed.
- Prepare and communicate the annual report on HCAs with feedbacks received from clinical department heads especially with reference to device associated infections and surgical site infections.
- Prepare and communicate the antibiogram of various clinical departments with feedback from Microbiology especially of multi-drug resistant organisms.
- Plan and conduct training of different healthcare workers with the respective heads of department, designated department coordinator and other members of HICC.
- Plan an annual surveillance program of healthcare workers with designated department and HICC members.
- Any other activity as identified by Dean.

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- Plan an annual surveillance program of healthcare workers with designated department and HICC members.
- Any other activity as identified by Dean.

Infection control Officer:

- The ICO supervises the surveillance of healthcare associated infections.
- He/she supervises the various infection control programs.
- Co-ordinate with the HICC in planning Infection Control Programme and Policies.
- Develops SOPs for various Infection Control Practices.
- Compile and disseminate data on monitoring of various infection control practices like hand hygiene audit, in-use disinfection testing, environmental microbial surveillance etc. to the stake holders.
- Compile and present the data of HAIs, hand hygiene audit, disinfection testing, Occupational exposure events, environmental testing etc. in the HICC Meetings.
- Keep a track of any developing outbreaks. Plan and participate in appropriate management of an outbreak.
- Participate, guide in research activities related to infection control practices and publish them.
- Advise on the appropriate use of antibiotics.
- Ensuring safe laboratory practices to prevent laboratory acquired infections among staff.
Monitoring sterilization, disinfection and the environment where necessary.

Infection control nurses:

The ICN is the link between the HICC and the wards/ICUs etc. in identifying problems and implementing solutions.

- The ICN conducts daily Infection control rounds and records his observation. He maintains records and statistics regarding IC activities.
- During the infection control rounds he does active surveillance for the four common HAIs namely, CLABSI (Central Line Associated Blood Stream Infection), CAUTI (Catheter Associated Urinary Tract Infection), VAP (Ventilator Associated Pneumonia) and SSI (Surgical Site Infection).
- The ICN ensures that all relevant positive culture cases are traced inpatient unit, if it complies with the definition of a HAI, a hospital infection surveillance sheet or surgical site infection sheet is filled and recorded.
- Work as a clinical supervisor by ensuring all the established policies and protocols are practiced like hand washing procedures, use of hand rubs, isolation policies, care of IV and vascular access, urinary catheters, universal precautions, housekeeping, cleaning and disinfection, PPE, equipment cleaning, etc.
- Performs on-site auditing of various Infection control practices especially, universal precautions like hand hygiene, use of PPE etc.

SSR

- Liaison between laboratory and ward staff: Informing head of department and giving advice on infection control issues.
 - Immediate attention in Needle Stick Injuries (NSIs) and other occupational exposures and facilitates post-exposure measures. Maintains registers and data of Sharps/NSIs and Post-exposure prophylaxis.
 - Notification of communicable diseases and other notifiable disease to the ICO.
 - The ICN is involved in education of practices minimising healthcare associated infections and hand hygiene among healthcare workers.
 - Informs anomalous/irrational use of antibiotics to ICO that must be discussed in HICC meetings.
 - Monitoring engineering activities like maintenance of water filters/RO plants registers and cleaning register of water tanks etc.
- Conducts special tasks given to him/her as per components and objectives of the hospital infection prevention and control.

Link Nurse

- Assist the HICC team in planning, implementation & evaluation of infection prevention & control measures.
- Participates in committees and meetings.
- Responsible for collection of targeted surveillance of hospital acquired infection (HAI) eg. (CAUTI, CRBSI, SSI, VAP, NSI, Hand hygiene) in wards, intensive care unit (ICCU) and High dependency unit (HDU)
- Assist the HICC team in identifying, controlling, and preventing outbreaks of infection. Notify multidrug resistant communicable organisms eg. MRSA to HICC and follows isolation and barrier practices for such a patients in their wards.
- Maintenance of cleaning and disinfection, deep weekly cleaning at cardiac ICU & HDU
- Part of the team that carries out audit in various aspect of infection.
 - To find out hospital infection rate by doing various Audit in targeted area.
 - Data collection regarding audit.
- Education
 - Organize training program and educational material.
 - Create awareness to control & Prevention hospital acquired infection.

Members:

- Promote a culture of safety in their own settings and in the hospital.
- Participate actively to achieve the objectives.
- Assist in investigating outbreaks as applicable.
- Plan, implement and update Infection Control Manual.
- Conduct training of their department staff on appropriate practices of infection prevention and control.

- Pharmacist to develop and ensure that the sterilization and disinfection practices are appropriate.
- Pharmacist to collect and review data periodically on antimicrobial indents from various departments.

Venue and frequency of meetings:

The Infection Control Team shall meet approximately once a month and HICC Committee shall meet approximately 4 times per year and at the call of the chairperson.

STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURES (General)
REVISED VERSION Dated 13th September 2022.

1. NAME: The name of the Institutional Ethics Committee shall be 'INSTITUTIONAL ETHICS COMMITTEE OF TOPIWALA NATIONAL MEDICAL COLLEGE AND B.Y.L. NAIR CHARITABLE HOSPITAL, MUMBAI'. Hereafter, the committee will be referred to as IEC.

2. PURPOSE, SCOPE & RESPONSIBILITY-

The purpose of this SOP is to establish effective functioning of the IEC so that a quality and consistent ethical and scientific review mechanism for health and biomedical research is put in place for all proposals dealt by the IEC.

Biomedical research includes research on pharmaceuticals, medical devices, medical radiation and imaging, surgical procedures, medical record and biological samples as well as epidemiological, social, psychological and similar research.

These SOPs are applicable to all the externally sponsored research proposals other than investigator initiated / dissertation / academic projects submitted to IEC and to be carried out at this institution.

Member secretary on behalf of IEC is responsible for implementing this SOP.

3. ROLE OF IEC:

- i. IEC will carry out the ethical and scientific review of biomedical and health research proposals involving human participants with a view to safeguard the dignity, rights, safety and well being of all actual and potential research participants.
- ii. The IEC will take care that all the cardinal principles of research ethics viz. Autonomy, Beneficence, Non-maleficence and Justice are taken care of in planning, conduct and reporting of the proposed research. For this purpose, it will look into the aspects of informed consent process, risk benefit ratio, distribution of burden and benefit and provisions for appropriate treatment and compensations wherever required.

- iii. It will review the proposals before start of the study as well as monitor the proposed research periodically and after completion of the study by way of documented procedures.
- iv. IEC will also examine compliance with all regulatory requirement, applicant guidelines and laws.

4. COMPOSITION OF IEC:

IEC shall be multidisciplinary and multi sectoral in composition.

There shall be minimum 7 to maximum 15 members in the IEC. The chairperson of the committee shall be from outside the institution. The member secretary shall be from within the institute and shall conduct the business of the IEC.

All the members including chairperson and member secretary shall be appointed by the Dean of the institute based on their competencies and integrity

IEC will consist of 7 to 15 members from the following categories

1. Chairperson - One Person from outside the institution (preferably a medical scientist)
2. Secretary - One Medical scientist / Clinician from within the institute
3. Member - One or more Lay person from the community
4. Member - One or more Legal expert
5. Member - One or more Non-scientific person such as social worker/representative of the no-governmental voluntary agency / ethicist / theologian / philosopher or a similar person

The other members forming the total composition should have good mix of institutional and non-institutional members. At least 50% of members should be non-institutional (external) members. There should be at least one pharmacologist and two medical scientists/clinicians in the committee. There should be adequate representation for different age groups, genders and communities in the IEC to safeguard the interest and welfare of all sections of the community/society.

The Dean if deemed necessary will appoint one more alternate member(s). The alternate member(s) will substitute one or more member(s) and attend the meeting in absence of the regular member(s). The alternate member(s) will have the same duties and responsibilities as the regular member(s). Medical scientist and clinician should have P.G. qualification. If required subject expert may be invited to give their views.

5. AUTHORITY UNDER WHICH IEC IS CONSTITUTED:

The Dean of the institution constitutes the IEC.

6. MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS:

- i. The Dean will invite the members to join IEC by sending the official appointment letter.
- ii. The members will confirm their acceptance to the Dean by providing all the required information for membership.
- iii. The duration of appointment of Chairman, secretary and IEC members will be for a tenure of 3 years and can be reappointed further for 3 years as suggested and approved by Dean and chairmany/ chairman.
- iv. A member can be replaced in the event of death or long term non-availability or for any action not commensurate with the responsibilities laid down in the guideline deemed unfit for a member
- v. A member can tender resignation from the IEC with reason to do so and shall give at least one month notice. The letter of resignation should be addressed to the Dean and forwarded by the IEC Secretary.
- vi. All members shall maintain confidentiality of all discussions during the meeting. Confidentiality agreement should be signed by the members at the time of appointment and renewal of appointment.
- vii. Conflict of interest should be declared by the members of IEC.
- viii. All members should undergo orientation program and training in national and international developments in bioethics / GCP once in every 3 years.
- ix. If the member remains absent for 3 consecutive meetings without informing and giving a valid reason then the member can be disqualified.
- x. No internal IEC members will be given any remuneration, but in special cases remuneration can be given by approval of Chairman and Dean.
- xi. In special cases like epidemics, disaster, the IEC meetings will be taken by Online video or Audio method as available. Participation by Audio video or telephonic method in such special expedited meetings will be granted as presence of members in such meeting.



7. QUORUM REQUIREMENTS

For review of each protocol the quorum of Ethics Committee should be atleast 5 members

with the following representations:

- i. basic medical scientists (preferably one pharmacologist).
- ii. Clinician.
- iii. legal expert.
- iv. social scientist / representative of non-governmental voluntary agency / philosopher / ethicist / theologian or a similar person.
- v. lay person from the community.

If the chairperson is absent then alternate chairperson shall be elected by the members present for the meeting from any of the member from outside the institute who shall conduct the meeting.

Official communication by IEC will be IEC mail / hard copy / What's app (Only amongst members for fast communication).

Secretariat will consist of adequate number of qualified and competent staff to assist the member secretary.

The member secretary shall be responsible for organizing the meeting, maintaining the records and communicating with all concerned stakeholders. The secretariat shall prepare the minutes of the meetings and send the minutes by EMAIL to all members 14 days before the next meeting. He should get the minutes approved in the next IEC meeting by all IEC members and obtain the Chairperson's signature on the approved minutes.

In absence of member secretary an internal member will hold charge temporarily.

9. INDEPENDENT CONSULTANTS

IEC may call upon subject expert as independent consultants who may provide special review of selected research proposal if need be. These experts may be specialists in medical specialties, ethical or legal aspects, specific diseases or methodologies, or represent specific communities, patient groups or special interest groups e.g. cancer patients, HIV/AIDS positive persons or ethnic minorities. They are required to give their specialized views in writing but they will not have right to vote which will be made by the members of the IEC only.

10. APPLICATION PROCEDURE

- i. All research proposals should be submitted in the prescribed application form, the details of which are given under documentation.
- ii. All relevant documents should be enclosed with application form.
- iii. Eleven copies of the proposal along with the application and document in prescribed format duly signed by the principal investigator/co-investigator / collaborators should be forwarded to the IEC with a covering letter signed by the head of the department. All IEC documents properly and neatly labeled and indexed should be submitted in the IEC office and the acknowledgement of submission should be taken from CCT of IEC.
- iv. All the proposals should be received at least 14 days before the date of the next IEC meeting.
- v. Every Research proposal will be allotted an IEC registration number to be used for all future correspondence and reference.
- vi. The date of the next meeting will be decided in the previous meeting and the date will be displayed in the IEC office.
- vii. PI should attend the meeting and give a short power point presentation of the project in the meeting after which the project will be discussed with the PI.
- viii. PI should be from this institute and the site of the study will be T.N.M.C. & B.Y.L. Nair Ch. Hospital.

11. DOCUMENTATIONS

For thorough and complete review, all research proposals should be submitted with the following documents :

- i. Invitation letter from Sponsor to the Principal Investigator to do the study.
- ii. Application form (Application letter of Principal Investigator signed by HOD of the department).
- iii. Summary sheet

- xiii. Professional Indemnity Policy indemnifying the PI and the Institution clearly indicating the conditions of coverage, date of commencement and date of expiry of coverage of risk. If indemnity policy is not available then an undertaking by the sponsored should be submitted by the PI. Failure to submit this Undertaking shall be liable for postponement of project review.
- xiv. Source of funding and financial requirements for the project.
- xv. Insurance liability copy and compensation policy for SAE occurring during the study. (Complete Insurance Policy document along with Insurance certificate).
- xvi. Curriculum Vitae of PI and GCP training certificate of all investigators.

- xviii. Undertaking by the investigator given to DCGI and IEC.

- xx. Statement of conflict of interest, if any.
- xxi. Any other information relevant to the study.

- xxiii. Whenever applicable letter of waiver of consent should be submitted.
- xxiv. Administrative sanction from the Dean to conduct the research study in this institution.
- xxv. Cheque Payment of IEC Review charges.

12. REVIEW PROCEDURES

- i. The meeting of the IEC will be held on scheduled intervals. IEC shall hold regular meeting once every month except during summer (May) and winter (October) vacation. The dates of the meeting should be fixed by the secretary in consultation with the chairperson and other members of the committee.
- ii. No Research projects will be accepted for review unless and until the necessary IEC review charges has been paid. Except for special cases like Govt. projects. The study related documents will not be accepted if all the required documents do not comply with the check list necessary for review of study protocol.
Office secretariat shall check all documents submitted before distribution to members.
- iii. The research proposal should be sent to the members at least 10 days before the next meeting for high quality review by members.
- iv. Decisions will be taken by consensus after discussion of the research proposal. However, if needed, in the absence of consensus, voting will be taken where all members except the Chairperson will cast their vote. In case of a tie, the chairperson may either cast a deciding vote or postpone the decision to the next meeting.
- v. Principal Investigator will be invited telephonically by CCT of IEC to attend the IEC meeting for Project related discussion with IEC and to offer clarifications if required. Principal Investigator will have to make a short power point presentation of the research proposal in the IEC meeting. It is compulsory for the Principal Investigator to be present for IEC meeting when Principal Investigators research proposal is discussed. In the absence of Principal Investigator, he /she should inform the IEC stating the reason for his/her absence alongwith the details of person who will presenting the project before the meeting. IEC may or may not accept the request depending upon the nature of the research proposal.
- vi. Independent consultants/experts may be invited to offer their opinion on specific research proposals, if needed.
- vii. All-important discussion /relevant discussion will be minuted. The decision will be minuted and chairperson's approval taken in writing.
- viii. All reply to IEC queries unless specifically required to go through the regular meeting (Reply to IEC query letter no. 1) will be examined by minimum 3 members decided by the Chairperson/ Member Secretary and if satisfactory project approved can be given.

13. **ELEMENTS OF REVIEW:** Following points will be considered while reviewing the research proposals

- i. Scientific design and conduct of the study.
- ii. Examination of predictable risks/harms.
- iii. Examination of potential benefits.
- iv. Examination of risk : benefit analyses.
- v. Procedure for selection of subjects in methodology including inclusion/ exclusion, withdrawal criteria and other issues like advertisement details.
- vi. Management of research related injuries, adverse events.
- vii. Compensation provisions.
- viii. Justification for placebo in control arm, if any.
- ix. Availability of products after the study(Post trial access of the IP), if applicable.
- x. Patient information sheet and informed consent form in local languages and provisions for taking appropriate informed consent process.
- xi. Protection of privacy and confidentiality.
- xii. Involvement of the community, wherever necessary.
- xiii. Plans for data analysis and reporting.
- xiv. Adherence to all regulatory requirements and applicable guidelines.
- xv. Qualification and Competence of investigators, research and supporting staff.
- xvi. Facilities and infrastructure of study sites.
- xvii. Criteria for withdrawal of patients, suspending or terminating the study.
- xviii. Use of disposal of stored or left over biological samples for future research.

14. EXPEDITED REVIEW

IEC will receive and consider the proposals for expedited review and approval for the studies having involving

- i. No or less than minimal risk to the trial participant.
- ii. Re-examination of a proposal already examined by the IEC.
- iii. Study of minor nature like the examination of case records.
- iv. An urgent proposal on national interest having minimum risk.
- v. Research involving non-identifiable specimen and human tissue from sources like blood bank, tissue banks and left over clinical samples.
- vi. Modification or amendment to an approved protocol including administrative changes or correction of typographical errors and change in researchers.

All revised proposals for expedited review unless specifically required to go through the regular meeting will be examined by minimum 3 members decided by the Chairperson/ Member Secretary. All the three members including the member secretary should be present for the meeting to expedite decision making.

Decision taken by the 3 members on expedited approval will be brought to the notice of the remaining committee members at the next regular meeting of IEC.

15. DECISION MAKING

- i. Members will discuss the various issues before arriving at a consensus decision
- ii. A member should withdraw from the meeting during the decision procedure concerning an application where a conflict of interest arises (i.e. if the member is Principal Investigator) and this should be intimated to the chairperson prior to the review of the application and recorded in the minutes.
- iii. Decisions will be made only in meetings where quorum is complete.
- iv. Only IEC members who participated in the review and discussions can make the decision. The expert consultants, if present, will only offer their opinion and they cannot vote.

- v. Decision may be to approve, reject or revise the proposals. Specific suggestions for modifications and reasons for rejection should be given. Revision of proposal may be necessary in case of proposals filled incompletely or incorrectly.
- vi. In cases of conditional decisions, clear suggestions for revision will be conveyed to the principal investigator. Reply letter from PI in response to queries will be reviewed by the Member Secretary or 3 members decided by the Chairperson / Member Secretary or the full board in the meeting and a decision will be taken.
- vii. Approval of a proposal shall be valid for a period of one year. IEC shall charge fees of Rs 12,000 (excluding T.D.S.) per year for the continuation in case of sponsored research projects.

16. COMMUNICATING THE DECISION :

- i. Decision will be communicated by the Member Secretary in writing (in the form of Approval letter or Query letter) within 14 days from the date of the meeting.
- ii. Approval decision will be communicated in a specified format.
- iii. Suggestions for modifications, if any, will be sent by IEC as Query letter.

- iv. Reasons for rejection will be informed to the Principal Investigator.
- v. The decision letter shall contain the following information :
 1. Date and time of IEC meeting
 2. Place of the meeting.
 3. Names and designations of the Chairperson and members who attended the meeting.
 4. Title of the research proposal.
 5. Name of the principal investigator
 6. List of documents (with date and version number wherever possible) reviewed by the IEC.
 7. A clear statement of the decision reached.
 8. Any advice or observations by the IEC.
 9. In the case of Negative decision, reasons for not approving the proposal will be mentioned.
 10. In the case of project Approval, the following responsibilities of the principal investigator must be communicated :
 - a. Acknowledgement of receipt of the letter of approval.
 - b. The approval is valid for one year from the date of issue of the Approval letter and if the project continues beyond a year, the Principal investigator must apply to IEC for Extension of IEC approval atleast 2 months prior to the expiry of IEC approval along with the current status report of the project.
 - c. Any change / amendments in the protocol or standard recording documents should be intimated to the IEC for information and approval. Even the administrative changes must be informed to IEC.
 - d. All serious adverse events during the study should be reported to the IEC within 24 hours, and the principal investigator should take appropriate measures to manage the SAE.
 - e. The principal investigator has to reply to the IEC queries within a period of 3 months of receiving the IEC query letter or as specified by IEC. If reply is not submitted to IEC within 6 months, the project will be closed and after 6 months, the same project will be considered as a new project and IEC review charges will have to be paid again.
 - f. The validity of the approval is for a period of one year. After approval, projects should be initiated at the earliest. For projects not initiated within one year of approval, continuation of approval may be given for one more year on

payment of applicable IEC charges and submission of updated data. If the project is not initiated within 24 months of initial approval, no further continuation shall be granted and the approval shall lapse.

g. In the case of study related injury /disability/ death of a research participant, the responsibility of compensation /treatment will rest on the sponsor / Principal Investigator of the trial as per the law.

h. The principal investigator should intimate to the IEC within 1 week if the trial is terminated and the reasons for doing so.

i. The final report including the results of the research should be communicated to the IEC within 6 months of completion of the project

j. The investigator shall be responsible to protect the dignity, rights, safety and well being of all research participants.

k. Investigator must obtain from Sponsor any new information that may affect the risk/benefit ratio of the research project and intimate the same to IEC at the earliest. IEC reserves the right to change the decision on the project in the light of any new information obtained.

17. FOLLOW UP PROCEDURE

i. IEC will periodically review the progress of all the studies for which Approval has been given. IEC will review status report once in a year and IEC may also conduct onsite monitoring.

ii. Progress of all the research proposals will be followed at a regular interval of at least once a year. But in some special situations, IEC will conduct the follow up review at shorter intervals based on the need, nature and events of research project.

iii. All on site Serious Adverse Events (SAEs) should be intimated to the IEC within 24 hours of knowing the occurrence. All on site SAEs should be reported in a specified format/Appendix XI mentioned in the separate SOP for managing SAEs at this institute. The SAE committee will consist of one basic medical scientist and two scientific clinician. The SAE committee member will review SAE's and their comments will be forwarded to regulatory authority within prescribed timeline.

iv. In case of SAE Serious Adverse Events occurring in the clinical trial subjects the principal investigator, after due analysis shall forward the SAE report to the licensing authority, Chairman of the IEC and Head of the institution within 14 calendar days of occurrence of the Serious Adverse Event.

- v. In case of Serious Adverse Events occurring to the clinical trial subjects, the IEC shall forward its report on the Serious Adverse Event, after due analysis, along with its opinion on the financial compensation, if any, to be paid by the sponsor, who had obtained permission from the licensing authority for conducting the clinical trial, to the Licensing authority within 30 calendar days of the occurrence of the Serious Adverse Event.
- vi. In the case of the study related injury / disability/ death of a research participant, the responsibility of compensation /treatment will rest on the sponsor of the trial.
- vii. Any amendment to the protocol should be submitted for IEC approval.
- viii. Protocol deviation, if any, should be informed with adequate justifications.
- ix. Any new information related to the study should be communicated that may affect the benefit/risk ratio of the study.
- x. Premature termination of study should be notified with reasons along with summary of the data obtained so far.
- xi. Principal Investigator must submit completion report along with the summary of the data obtained.
- xii. Final report of the study should be sent to the IEC within a period of 6 months of completion.
- xiii. Change of investigators at our site should be informed to IEC within a week.
- xiv. IEC secretary shall send reminder to the PI one month before expiry of 1 year from the approval date of the project, to apply for renewal / extension of the project. If PI does not renew or ask extension of the project within 3 months of expiry of 1 year then project will be assumed to be closed / terminated.

- 1) Dr. Shailesh Mohite, Dean and Chairperson (HICC) chaired the 4th- HICC 2025 meeting. Dr. Nishat Khan read out the Minutes of 3rd HICC Meeting held on 23rd September 2025, also it was circulated to all members prior to the meeting. The Chair opened the floor for any amendments or corrections to the minutes. After a brief discussion and no major objections or modifications being raised, the minutes were approved by Dr Unnati Desai, seconded by Dr Sushma Save.
- 2) An issue that was raised at the pervious HICC meeting, regarding the storage of samples in the refrigerator for a long time. Dr Satish Dharap had instructed the sister incharges to clean the refrigerator twice a week in the morning as compared to once a week which is being done at present. On rounds by the ICN the refrigerators are found to be clean. Dean Sir instructed the sister in charges to be vigilant regarding the same.
- 3) KPIs of Hospital acquired infections from the month of January to November 2025 were discussed. The KPIs rates for VAP are high this is due to the presence of long term admitted patients. Dr Unnati informed the members that reporting of VAP is done only in case of persistent bugs not for colonizers.
- 4) Hand hygiene compliance is low in HCWs persistently. It was suggested to install hand sanitizer stands in the central area of each ward. Nursing staff informed shortage of hand sanitizers to which Dean Sir directed to increase the supply of the same. (Letter to be sent to the medical store regarding the supply for hand sanitizers).
- 5) Dr Nishat also informed the members that the NSIs are still high inspite of training programs and has requested the members and ICO to please monitor the interns for safe injection practices among the new nursing students and interns during blood collection

- 6) BMW issues: Dean Sir informed the Assistant Matron that BMW is not being segregated as per the BMW rules. ICN Tanvi mentioned that there are no labels on the bags and the waste is being brought to central collection area after 5pm leading to collection of waste in the area. To tackle this problem following needs to be done
- Biomedical Waste from ward to be sent before 4pm (responsibility of S/I of the respective wards) along with label having ward number and date. No waste will be accepted after 5pm.
 - Bags without labels will not be accepted.
 - CCTV will be monitored and strict action will be taken against defaulters.
 - Letter to be written to AE (M& E) whether CCTV is installed in that area and to check for availability of footage.

HOSPITAL INFECTION CONTROL COMMITTEE

OBJECTIVES:

- To establish and maintain a database describing endemic rates of HCAs. Once endemic rates are known, then the occurrence of an epidemic can be detected when infection rates exceed baseline values.
- To identify trends manifested over a finite period, such as shifts in microbial pathogen spectrum, infection rates, etc.
- To provide continuous observation of HCAs cases for the purpose of prevention and control to obtain useful information for establishing priorities for infection control activities.

FUNCTIONS:

- Develop and recommend written policies and procedures pertaining to infection prevention and control.
- Update the policies based on evolving evidence
- Recognize and investigate outbreaks of infections in the hospital.
- Educate and train healthcare workers, patients, and relatives as applicable.
- Monitor practices regularly and periodically.
- Conduct surveillance on HCAI by collecting data from respective departments, analyse and suggest appropriate measures
- Collect annual antibiogram data from microbiology department, analyse and provide feedback
- Develop, implement and monitor antibiotic policy with the antibiotic audit sub-committee
- Develop, implement and monitor infection prevention practices in operating rooms with the Theatre sub-committee
- Develop, implement and monitor airborne infection control plan with Airborne Infection Control sub-committee
- Develop and implement policies pertaining to isolation
- Implement and monitor biomedical waste management
- Provide guidance on setting up of infrastructure, engineering and ventilation that would minimize the risk of infection
- Communicate effectively with concerned staff/ department
- Stay updated with the current developments

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Chairman:

- Serve as the chairperson of the committee and nominate the convener / secretary.
- Constitute sub-committees to oversee specific infection prevention plans.
- Ensure that appropriate resources in terms of manpower, equipment and consumables are available at all times to prevent the risk of infection.
- Ensure that effective arrangements are in place for infection prevention and control and that appropriate resources are made available to manage the risks of infection.
- Promote a culture of safety and accountability in all staff members.
- Approve suggestions of the committee and authorize the committee to monitor compliance.
- Approve the list of committee members and their role.
- Review the data on HCAs and approve suggested corrective measures.
- In absentia, authorize Deputy Dean to chair the committee.

Secretary / Convener

- Report directly to Dean.
- Convene meetings after obtaining consent from the chairperson.
- Identify the agenda / points of discussion for these meetings.
- Oversee local infection control policy implementation with ICC, ICO and ICN.
- Authorized by chairperson / Dean, to intervene when inappropriate practices are brought to notice by ICD / ICN.
- Assess the impact of current practices, provide feedback to department/s and section /s and with HICC plan appropriate interventions if needed.
- Prepare and communicate the annual report on HCAs with feedbacks received from clinical department heads especially with reference to device associated infections and surgical site infections.
- Prepare and communicate the antibiogram of various clinical departments with feedback from Microbiology especially of multi-drug resistant organisms.
- Plan and conduct training of different healthcare workers with the respective heads of department, designated department coordinator and other members of HICC.
- Plan an annual surveillance program of healthcare workers with designated department and HICC members.
- Any other activity as identified by Dean.

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HICC Secretary

Infection control Officer:

- The ICO supervises the surveillance of healthcare associated infections.
- He/she supervises the various infection control programs.
- Co-ordinate with the HICC in planning Infection Control Programme and Policies.
- Develops SOPs for various Infection Control Practices.
- Compile and disseminate data on monitoring of various infection control practices like hand hygiene audit, in-use disinfection testing, environmental microbial surveillance etc. to the stake holders.
- Compile and present the data of HAIs, hand hygiene audit, disinfection testing, Occupational exposure events, environmental testing etc. in the HICC Meetings.
- Keep a track of any developing outbreaks. Plan and participate in appropriate management of an outbreak.
- Participate, guide in research activities related to infection control practices and publish them.
- Advise on the appropriate use of antibiotics.
- Ensuring safe laboratory practices to prevent laboratory acquired infections among staff.
Monitoring sterilization, disinfection and the environment where necessary.

Infection control nurses:

The ICN is the link between the HICC and the wards/ICUs etc. in identifying problems and implementing solutions.

- The ICN conducts daily Infection control rounds and records his observation. He maintains records and statistics regarding IC activities.
- During the infection control rounds he does active surveillance for the four common HAIs namely, CLABSI (Central Line Associated Blood Stream Infection), CAUTI (Catheter Associated Urinary Tract Infection), VAP (Ventilator Associated Pneumonia) and SSI (Surgical Site Infection).
- The ICN ensures that all relevant positive culture cases are traced inpatient unit, if it complies with the definition of a HAI, a hospital infection surveillance sheet or surgical site infection sheet is filled and recorded.
- Work as a clinical supervisor by ensuring all the established policies and protocols are practiced like hand washing procedures, use of hand rubs, isolation policies, care of IV and vascular access, urinary catheters, universal precautions, housekeeping, cleaning and disinfection, PPE, equipment cleaning, etc.
- Performs on-site auditing of various Infection control practices especially, universal precautions like hand hygiene, use of PPE etc.

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HICC Secretary

- Liaison between laboratory and ward staff: Informing head of department and giving advice on infection control issues.
 - Immediate attention in Needle Stick Injuries (NSIs) and other occupational exposures and facilitates post-exposure measures. Maintains registers and data of Sharps/NSIs and Post-exposure prophylaxis.
 - Notification of communicable diseases and other notifiable disease to the ICO.
 - The ICN is involved in education of practices minimising healthcare associated infections and hand hygiene among healthcare workers.
 - Informs anomalous/irrational use of antibiotics to ICO that must be discussed in HICC meetings.
 - Monitoring engineering activities like maintenance of water filters/RO plants registers and cleaning register of water tanks etc.
- Conducts special tasks given to him/her as per components and objectives of the hospital infection prevention and control.

Link Nurse

- Assist the HICC team in planning, implementation & evaluation of infection prevention & control measures.
- Participates in committees and meetings.
- Responsible for collection of targeted surveillance of hospital acquired infection (HAI) eg. (CAUTI, CRBSI, SSI, VAP, NSI, Hand hygiene) in wards, intensive care unit (ICCU) and High dependency unit (HDU)
- Assist the HICC team in identifying, controlling, and preventing outbreaks of infection. Notify multidrug resistant communicable organisms eg. MRSA to HICC and follows isolation and barrier practices for such a patients in their wards.
- Maintenance of cleaning and disinfection, deep weekly cleaning at cardiac ICU & HDU
- Part of the team that carries out audit in various aspect of infection.
 - To find out hospital infection rate by doing various Audit in targeted area.
 - Data collection regarding audit.
- Education
 - Organize training program and educational material.
 - Create awareness to control & Prevention hospital acquired infection.

Members:

- Promote a culture of safety in their own settings and in the hospital.
- Participate actively to achieve the objectives.
- Assist in investigating outbreaks as applicable.
- Plan, implement and update Infection Control Manual.
- Conduct training of their department staff on appropriate practices of infection prevention and control.

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HICC Secretary

- Pharmacist to develop and ensure that the sterilization and disinfection practices are appropriate.
- Pharmacist to collect and review data periodically on antimicrobial indents from various departments.

Venue and frequency of meetings:

The Infection Control Team shall meet approximately once a month and HICC Committee shall meet approximately 4 times per year and at the call of the chairperson.
